Subject: Reversible lanes


Hi Kathy,

Per our brief discussion last night during the open house, the county of Kauai utilizes reversible lanes at least 5 days per week in the mornings. They simply utilize orange cones in the morning to mark the reversed lane, then remove them sometime in the mid-morning (road is permanently marked for northbound traffic being 2 lanes and/or 1 lane plus center turn lane).

Given the amount of tourism, a large # of drivers are NOT necessarily used to this, however in 20+ times I've been there, I can't recall seeing an accident that may have been a result of lane confusion personally, however it would be interesting to talk w/ their DOT and get actual stats.

All in all, I'd guess they have roughly 3-5 miles that they reverse in the mornings (~5 am to 10am?). They've been doing this for years - so it certainly could be a low-cost interim option for Sammamish. Basically cost would be for the cones, a truck/driver and a person to place the cones:5x/week and pickup 5/x per week.






Missed the open house due to death of a family member, but have some input:

Anyone on the North end of plateau knows the bottleneck is the hill running from intersection of 202/Sahalee Way NE up to NE 36th Street - this is going down the hill in the morning and up the hill in afternoon.

At least put a truck lane running from 202 up the hill, and real solution is 2 lanes each way. All the other things on the table will do nothing for the congestion: if you have an type of traffic study you will readily see this obvious issue. Why is the non-solution being proposed? It is waste of resources that does not address the critical priority need,





Hello Jed – I am a resident on NE 36th ST, which is one of the main streets for entrance and exit from Sahalee community. Safety issues and extended wait time to be able to turn into or turn out of NE 36th St. has become a significant concern for our community. Planned improvements for sidewalks on 228th, projected traffic growth on 228th over the next few years and the recent development of the Evans Creek Preserve warrants the need for a traffic light and crosswalk to be installed at the intersection of 228th and NE36th St. Please advocate for this safety and accessibility improvement. Thank you.



November 3, 2015

Dear Jed.

I was given your name as the person to contact regarding the 228th/Sahalee Way improvements. We plan to attend the meeting tomorrow night, but would also like to email our thoughts in advance.

We have lived on 36th St for 13 years, one block from NE Sahalee Park and the main gate to the Sahalee golf course neighborhood. Our children enjoyed NE Sahalee Park for many years and now we also have Evans Creek Preserve to enjoy. Thank you for the amazing work the city has done there! It is our favorite place to walk and is a real treasure.

Our concerns involve both driver and pedestrian safety issues at the 36th St/Sahalee Way intersection.

Our requests:

- 1. A timed traffic light at the intersection of 36th St. and Sahalee Way. 36th Street is the only access to Sahalee Way for our neighborhood, and it's the main-gate access for Sahalee. It has always been a difficult turn that requires much patience, particularly during the heavy commuting hours, but it is increasingly dangerous. We've seen several close calls and fear it's only a matter of time before a serious accident occurs. Wait times are growing unreasonable. We've seen as many as 13 cars backed up on 36th St waiting to turn, including LWSD school buses that pick up and drop off kids at the NE Sahalee Park. Blackwell, Inglewood and Eastlake buses all stop here and have to navigate the difficult and dangerous turn.
- 2. A lower speed limit on Sahalee. Along with the sheer volume of traffic that makes it difficult to turn onto Sahalee, many drivers coming from Hwy 202 continue driving at highway speeds up the Sahalee Way hill. We'd support lowering the speed limit to 35-40 miles per hour.
- 3. A lighted crosswalk connecting NE Sahalee Park and Evans Creek, at 36th St. Evans Creek is a wonderful place to walk, but it's not safe for walkers to get to. We'd like to see a crosswalk at the end of 36th St., connecting NE Sahalee Park and Evans Creek. Currently, walkers are bolting across Sahalee and dodging cars (guilty). We fear this is also an accident waiting to happen. A crosswalk here would also increase access to the mail box that's on Sahalee Way next to Evans Creek.
- 4. Pedestrian sidewalks all the way into Evans Creek. There are currently no sidewalks on Sahalee or along the driveways into the Evans Creek parking lot. The sidewalks pick up at the end of the driveways, serving those who drive there, not those of us who walk in.

Thank you for your time. We are pleased to hear the city will be improving Sahalee Way.

> This safe access is desperately needed. Right now we have to cross the street at the traffic light then walk almost right up against 228th Ave on a very dangerous corner where cars are doing 45 mph, to get to the Evans Creek park entrance.

> I hope I have misread the planning documents, please clarify how access to the Evans Creek park will be improved as part of this project.

If the City of Sammamish doesn't plan to include this as an open detour route on/off the north plateau at the NE 43rd Street barricade during all phases of Sahalee Way construction, please let me know.

All plans for Sahalee Way improvement should include the opening of this barricade as a critical detour route off the north end of Sammamish.

Thanks for taking the time after our finance committee meeting to discuss the Sahalee Way project.

if you would not, read what is beliw cild and let me know your inpression.

"The detailed engineering design phase is about to begin. This work will entail detailed survey, geotechnical exploratio, hydraulic analysis, and preparation of engineering plans and specifications.

The scope of the project includes new sidewalk, planter strip and bije lane in the west side of the road; widened shoulder/bike lane on the east side, and continuous two-way left turn lane or median down the road."

Although the first paragraph inficates "work is about to begin", the second paragraph states that the scope has been established. I did not bother rewriting the second paragraph in the flyer, which paragraph invites resident input. The wau I read this, I surmise the current city position to be that while we have not started engineering work, the city has decided on the scope of the work. To me this means that resident input, if considered, might result in minor changes at best. I thought the entire project was put on hold oending further study of options in luding connections with SR's 202 and 520.

Also, it seems like the flyer should have mentioned the No ember 10 meeting (killing two meeting messages with ine stone).

Transparent communication. Seems key for success. The flyer, albeit short, leaves me believing that the city has decided what it wants to do and the resident input is perfunctory, without any communication in options (four lane versus three, connections downstream, etc.).
