Issaquah-Fall City Road Improvements Project

Phase I Design: 242nd Avenue SE to Klahanie Drive SE

About the Project

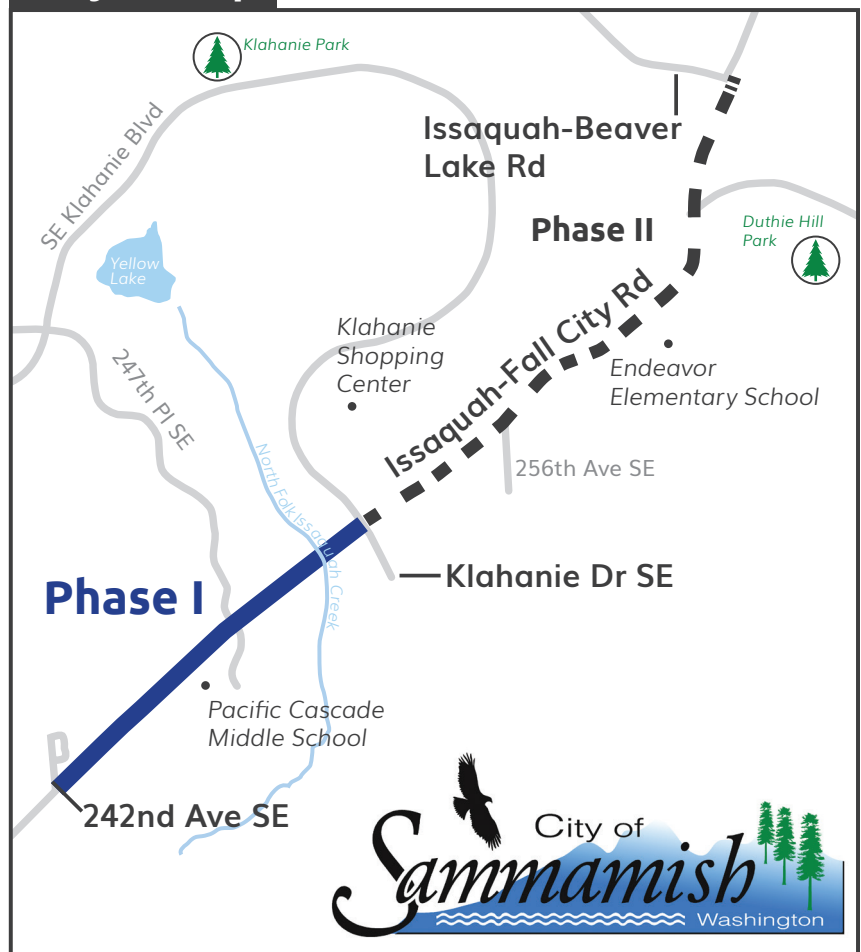
With over 1,800 vehicles travelling along the roadway during peak hours, and few alternate routes, Issaquah-Fall City Road is one of the most highly used roads in the area. The current shape and slope of the roadway can create difficult sightlines for drivers, pedestrians and cyclists. Roadway improvements are needed to reduce congestion and improve safety for all users.

The City of Sammamish plans to improve Issaquah-Fall City Road between 242nd Avenue SE and Issaquah-Beaver Lake Road to:

- Improve safety along the roadway and at intersections for those driving, cycling, walking along, or crossing the corridor.
- Add capacity by increasing the number of travel lanes for turning and through traffic.
- Reduce congestion and improve access to neighborhoods, businesses, community organizations, and public spaces.
- Protect mature trees and environmentally sensitive areas, such as stream crossings and wetlands.

The City of Sammamish is planning improvements to Issaquah-Fall City Road from 242nd Avenue SE to Issaquah-Beaver Lake Road that will add capacity and improve safety.

Project map



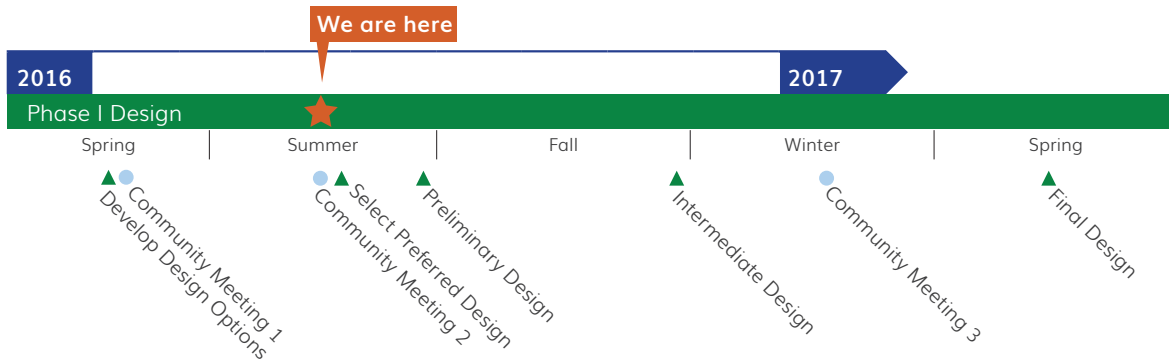
Working with the Community

The City of Sammamish is excited to work with the community during the design of the Issaquah-Fall City Road Improvements Project. The City's goal is for the final design of the roadway to reflect community priorities and feedback. The City will seek feedback at major project milestones, and keep the community informed as design progresses. Early in the design process, feedback will be gathered from City Council, community groups, and the public on goals and priorities to shape the vision for the design. As design progresses, the City will ask for feedback on some of the specific design components and details, such as lighting, landscaping, sidewalk design and more. Project Schedule

In Spring 2016, the City of Sammamish started design for Phase I of the Issaquah-Fall City Road Improvements Project. During Phase I the City will consider alternatives and finalize the design for Issaquah-Fall City Road Improvements between 242nd Avenue SE and Klahanie Drive SE. The Phase I final design is expected to be completed by Spring 2017.

Construction of Phase I is planned to begin in 2017 or 2018 once all funding has been approved. Design for Phase II is expected to begin in 2018. Design decisions made during Phase I of the project will influence the options and design for Phase II. The City will provide updates on the project schedule once funding has been secured.
